Apply for Housing

Most first- and second-year students are required to live in university housing. You'll be able to start working on your housing contract roughly 24 hours after accepting your admission offer. On the online housing contract, you will identify residence hall, dining, roommate, and other preferences. Register for Orientation

Orientation is required for all new students and provides a solid foundation for success at Miami. Through orientation, new students will:

Placement Testing

Miami uses placement tests to inform academic advising and course registration.

Verification

Verification is the process by which the Office of Student Financial Aid confirms, through documentation, the accuracy of the information provided on your FAFSA. You will be notified if you were selected for notification. Current students can view their Unsatisfied Requirements on the Home tab in <u>Banner 9 Self Service - Financial Aid</u>. Missing requirements will delay payment of financial aid and could disrupt your enrollment. Apply for a Federal Work Study Job

The Federal Work-Study Program is a federally funded, campus-based aid program designed to provide part-time jobs for eligible students with financial need. All students, regardless of financial need, are eligible to seek a campus job, but students are only able to be hired under the Federal Work-Study Program if identified in your financial aid package.

Transportation & Parking

First year students are restricted from having a car on campus unless their permanent home address is more than 200 miles from the university, or if they have filled out an exceptional transportation need (ETN) request form and it has been approved. These requests typically relate to a medical need, an off-campus job, or a class on another Miami campus.

Student Health Insurance & Proof of Immunization

Miami University requires all full-time Oxford students be covered by health insurance. To that end, all Oxford students registered full-time when the fall semester bill is generated are charged for health insurance unless the student has completed and been granted a waiver of the student health insurance. This process must be completed **annually** for all full-time Oxford students. The waiver form typically becomes available in July.
